YABA COLLEGE OF TECHNOLOGY LIBRARY: RESOURCES UTILISATION FOR EFFECTIVE SERVICES DELIVERY TO USERS COMMUNITY

ABSTRACT: The paper looked at Yaba College of Technology, library Lagos in the provision of information resources and services to students and staff of the institution. Questionnaire was the instrument use for gathering data from One hundred (100) respondents which were randomly selected out of which eighty (80) were returned and found useful for the study. This research revealed that majority of the respondents were aware of the existence of library in the school but do not fully utilized it because the information resources of the library are outdated that could not meet information needs of user due to the above constraints the respondents look elsewhere to get their information need satisfied. The study then gave some recommendations as a way forward to promote effective service delivery by the library to the target users. Amongst these is that there is a need to have a functional library with modern information resources (ICT) with qualified personnel with adequate skills essential for effective utilization of e- resources. In order to ensure that staff of the library is efficient in their daily services delivery library as essential information center should at least once in a year attend a skill acquisition programme relevant to their areas of operations. In order for the library to play its role, especially in this Information age, it must be adequately funded by the government and other stakeholders. The failure of academic library like that of Yaba College of Technology has been largely responsible for failure of Nigerian academic institutions in overall global rating of the academic institution in which Yaba College of technology is known as one of the foremost academic institutions in the world assessment team

INTRODUCTION

Yaba College of Technology, Lagos, Nigeria officially opened its door to students and staff on 19th January, 1934 in line with Alokun, (2004) cited from Fafunwa, (1975). In the history of academic institutions in Nigeria Yaba higher College that was name at the time of its establishment marked as the centre. of excellence for human capital development, offering the first rate academic, professional and entrepreneurial education as a bedrock for leapfrogging Nigerian's technological development Olugbile (2009). The College library as one of the essential units of this citadel of learning is the library that serves as the academic nerve centre of the institution saddled with the service with the provision of information service that emanate from the acquisition, processing, distribution of information resources in line with the curriculum of the institution. In the same vein the library is set up to serve the student, lecturers and other member of the academic community (Aina, 2014).

Services Units of Yaba College of Technology, Library.

To offered the expected services to the teaming population of the College , the library at Yaba College of Technology has different services unit put in place for users to annexed for their benefit. The library collections of library at the beginning according to Adegbile (1988) as cited by Alokun (2004) The services Centre are: Administrative Coordinating unit, Reader's Services unit, Technical Services unit, Serials Department, Information & Communication Technology (ICT) Centre and the Archives, Research and Documentation Units. The College library has come a long way since its evolution as a service unit of the academic learning centre in Nigeria despite the teething problems facing it that manifest in staff turnover, lack of adequate incentives among the staff of the library and more importantly inadequate fund (Alokun, 2004).

> Administrative Coordinating unit

This is the administrative Centre of the Library; the coordinating unit of the services institution that produce educational output. This unit defines the role and the service of each section of the library that provide information service behind the scene for the identified users. All communications between the library and the entire users' community pass through the desk of the College Librarian who is the Administrator and chief Executive of the library services.

Reader's Services Unit

This essential services Centre is the public relations unit of the Library whose function include, registration of all students and staff, charging and discharging of Library materials; shelving and shelf reading of library resources on daily basis; the maintenance of reference and audio-visual materials are one of the essential routine exercises of the unit furthermore, the readers services unit of this library also see to the updating and documenting the statistical records of library Clienteles and book consulted on daily basis. Among the oversight function of the readers service section of the library is the circulation section that ensure that books are on the shelves on loan or taken out for repairs (Aina,2014)

> Technical Services Department

The Technical Services Department is the engine room of the library, responsible for the processing of all materials acquired through gifts, exchange and other method of resources development in line with Collection .development policy of the library, the section is saddled with the responsibility of Acquisition, Cataloguing and Classification of the books in the library with the aim of making the library resources available to relevant section where users may have a direct link with the learning resources for consultation, research and community effort. The Technical Services section also undertakes repairs of all defective library information

As their role involved giving a bibliographical description of library resources in generated computer work sheets for the ICT units of the College. Filling and maintenance of the Library catalogue cards that contain a summary of the details of all the library resource.

Serials Department

The Serials Section of the Yaba College of Technology library, Lagos major function include selection, acquisition and processing of printed and electronics Journals. The College Library subscribed to the lor College website offered opportunity to library personnel and students to have access to current and relevant E-journals in line with the school programme. the Journal

> Information and Communication Technology Department.

The Information and Communication technology departments of the College are saddled with computer operation unit of the Library. The department uses the Lib-Plus Library Software Package to carry out its daily routine services as related to automation and computer appreciation programme. The department oversees the Computer Laboratory Centre that has flat screen desktop computer used by staff and students of the College for lectures and other academic exercises. It is worthy of note, that the emergence of ICT has enables proper and adequate provision of library services to library users from all disciplines in this academic institution It is worthy of note, that the emergence of ICT has impacted greatly on the quality of information provided by the library to users. It also enables proper and adequate provision to all the library users from all disciplines in the polytechnic.

Archives, Research and Documents Department

This department serves as archival unit of the College library. The unit acquires preserves and makes rare documents available and accessible to users; it also assists staff and students in their research effort. It keeps Gazettes, Legal documents, Building plans. Convocation Speeches, Lectures, Seminar Papers, Past Questions Papers for reference purposes and future use. The six departments above combined together to provide information resources for users community of the College. Within the context of the library, information science and information resources can be referred to as any information carrier devices manually or electronics like textbooks or journals. Theses and Dissertation, Audio Visual, Software, Hardware organised for implementation of the educational programmes of particular academic institution Opeke and Odunlade (2011).

The extent to which the library services meet the information expectation of the patrons will go a long way for users to create utilization the information resources of the library regularly. The adequacy and ease of accessibility of library resources may determine the level of utilization of information resource of the library, if the resources are not available for users to make use of, the purpose of having the library is defeated and in the other way if the resources are available and users are not having access to them the purpose of setting up the library is not achieved.

Thus, one can then say that there is the need for library resources to be available for users while the users on their part should be aware of the resources for their benefit in their academic and other essential duty that has a direct link to library.

The mere acquisition of information resources by a library does not translate into accessibility and that granting access to library information resources requires a series of process that the librarian put into the work of library that is demonstrated in acquisition, cataloguing classification indexing, and internal routine exercises that is carried out behind the screen that translated into availability of information resources of the library.

In summary it can be deduced that utilization of information resources assists the users to have a broad knowledge as attested by Madu, (2004) that stated that it is imperative for library personnel and its users to acquire the needed skills that will assist them to sieve through the ocean of information overload available at local and international level, through the devices of Information and communication technology. In today library services delivery it has undergone a significant metamorphosis – from a purely traditional model manual service delivery to a more dynamic technologically driven system through the devices of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) which Ekoja, (2010). opined that the environment in which librarians work is changing in the areas of accessibility of information resources, increased in speed in acquiring of information which is more easier than the old method of services delivery in locating, analyzing and linking information, adaptation and continuous learning for users and staff adopting the eresources .

Although the advent of Internet has proven that the manual are inherent with some limitation in which is significant in today information world. However, the majority of the librarians in Nigeria still operate the traditional mode of service delivery which cannot meet or satisfy the expected desire of the dynamic library users who want to get the needed information resources without constraints. Other challenges users encounter in the use of e- resources is lack of needed skills to e-resources, students are not having access to computers and other ICTs effective utilize the resources, irregular internet services, outdated information resources like textbooks and Journals and power outage and accessibility to the needed resources at the expected time by the library where users can make use of the resources for their advantages. There are various reasons why library users utilize the information resources which may include wealth creation, competition for sustainable development. Accelerate the activities of the work of students as relate the use of eresources which is meant to provide the right information in right format to the right person at the right time. While looking at the accessibility of library resources, Adeoye et al (2011) added that the more accessible information sources are the least effort users have in accessing the library resources. Siu-Runyan (2011) added that the quality of libraries resources at the college level correlate with the performance of students writing internal examination within the level and professional that student tool part for certification.

Thus one can say that College libraries are important information resources and aids that any student in any institution of learning cannot dissociate from if they must make a way out in their academic career. Previous studies provided evidence that when students in College have

One hundred (100) respondents were randomly selected out of which eighty (80) were returned and found useful for the study. The data collected were properly recorded by assigning scores to each of the variable associated with each item on the questionnaire. The outcome of the scoring was coded and use for subsequent analysis. The statistical method used for the analysis was simple percentage which was presented in tabular form to show the significant difference between the various variables on the questionnaire.
